

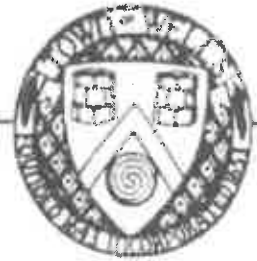

**Press Release: March 13<sup>th</sup>, 2018**

**WELLS PUBLIC LIBRARY**  
**January/February 2018 MONTHLY REPORT**  
**Prepared for the March 14th Board of Trustees Meeting**

**Youth Services:**

- The Mother Goose program is for children ages 0-24 months and their caregivers. The focus is on lap activities, rhymes, songs, and fingerplays, as well as books. We presented 3 programs to 72 people in January and 3 programs to 59 people in February.
- Toddler Time is a program for kids aged 2-5 years old and their caregivers. This program focuses on longer stories, songs and movement, all followed by a craft. We presented 8 programs to 138 people in January and 7 programs to a total of 114 people in February.
- Our Rubik's Cube and Lego Club met 4 times in January with 64 people and met 3 times and totaled 47 people in February.
- Our monthly Random Fandom met January 3<sup>rd</sup> with a focus on the Maze Runner series. 21 teens attended.
- The teen craft on January 10<sup>th</sup> was Kumihimo braiding, with 22 teens participating.
- The monthly Family Party on January 18<sup>th</sup> had a train theme with 63 attendants.
- 11 teens made Rice Krispie Snowmen on January 24<sup>th</sup> at the Teen Food Workshop.
- We had 32 teens attend our monthly Gaming Competition on January 31<sup>st</sup>.
- 35 teens painted glass using glue and food coloring to make it look like sea glass on February 14<sup>th</sup>.
- Magician BJ Hickman performed to an audience of 151 people on February 21<sup>st</sup>.
- 32 people attended our Chinese New Year Party on February 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- There were 77 people at the Chewonki Bugmobile presentation on February 23<sup>rd</sup>.
- We had 23 teens attend our monthly Gaming Competition on February 28<sup>th</sup>.
- Allison went to 4 different preschools and daycares a total of 7 times and visited the elementary school once in the month of January. 120 people were reached. Allison visited 4 different daycares and preschools a total of 6 times the month of February, reaching 77 people.
- We had 4 teen volunteers these 2 months, totaling 20 hours.

**Building:**

- New motionless door assists were added on 2/1/18
- Ceiling lowered in non-fiction section to accommodate sprinkler pipes on 3/1/18. Crew did an exceptional job, arriving at 4:00am and finishing just after we opened at 1:30.
  - Art gallery decal is a little high, will probably get a new one.
