Press Release: December 18, 2018

Subject: Thank You, 11 years later

Lieutenant Chabot,

My name is Corrections Officer Joshua Moulton, I'm with the Cumberland County Sheriffs Office. You may not remember me, but I remember you and your officers, you inspired me to be where I am today.

It was roughly 2006/2007, my family lived at 455 Burnt Mill Road. My parents, Scott and Jamye Moulton, were going through a rough divorce. You guys were over to my house a lot, my dad was going through some mental health issues and was suicidal. I remember one morning it was 3am, I woke up and saw you and another officer talking to my mom. I didn't feel scared, I wasn't angry that my dad was going away, I knew the police were here and everything was going to be ok.

There was another time, my dad got arrested. I can't remember if it was OUI or the DV Terrorizing. My brother Jacob and I were left sleeping in our beds. My dad woke us up with a police officer behind him, and we went to our moms while he went to jail. Just the caring demeanor of that officer, I guess it left a mark on me.

I spent plenty of time crying alone in my room throughout those first years of the divorce, because things sucked. For one reason or another, you guys were always back, each time I appreciated that a police officer was making sure I was ok. My mom would talk about you, and how you would mediate arguments. I'm sure you thought some of those arguments were both stupid and needless, which frankly they were.

So it hit me that I wanted to be the kind of person. My mom moved us to Arundel and I went to Thornton Academy. I loved Wells, I had a lot of friends there, but I got the chance to become a Saco Police Explorer.

The Explorers was a great experience, I got plenty of hands on experience and got to attend the Maine Law Enforcement Explorer Academy.

After high school (I graduated in 2015), I was a Community Safety Officer with the Kennebunkport Police Department for three summers. The last summer I started working security at Southern Maine Health Care. So I actually got experience dealing with mental health issues.

This is the part where I tell you that my relationship with my dad is great. Those awful days are in the past. My dad and I have two different opinions on the police involvement. Know that I appreciate the work you put in.

The story is almost over. I got hired by Cumberland County as a CO and graduated the 36th Basic Corrections Training Program this past month. We had some domestic
