 Harbor Pier Structural Improvements: MaineDOT has awarded the Town, through the Harbormaster's efforts and the Town's CIP budgeting, a grant to assist in the funding of structural repairs and improvements to the main pier on the Western side of the Harbor. A pre-construction was held Thursday (1/10) on the project which is expected to commence with demolition activities in the next week to 10 days.






Optional Fire Substation Site – Voters approved on 11/6/18 the Special Town Meeting Article that allows the Board of Selectmen to evaluate an alternative site for the approved new sub firestation for town land on Route 109 at Meetinghouse Road. The alternative site is on the current town parcel that the PWD Garage is located –see below. The evaluation will compare the same building on the two sites and their site development cost as well as other factors. On January 8, 2019, the Board of Selectmen met with the Architects and Construction Management Company to discuss the results of the site analysis. The Selectmen after much discussion both at the workshop and at their meeting voted to proceed with the alternative site for the Fire Substation and would also continue discussions with the Fire Chief on possibly keeping the Wells Branch Substation open. In addition they requested the Town Manager present to them a Warrant Article to sell the 109 site of the fire substation.
